Protecting God's Children: Dear Parishioners in order to comply with the demand to protect our youth in the Church and to continue what we have started with the seminar we had in September 2018 we are still required to complete a CODE of Conduct in the website of www.virtusonline.org If a CODE OF CONDUCT has not been completed, one should be able to go into the online training tab, do so, and then complete a background check. Especially when you see a similar message on your screen:

You must complete a background check

Re-opening our Church

Dear Parishioners, in compliance with the requirements of State of Massachusetts Safety Standards to reopen Places of worship (see attached file) Starting this weekend 23rd – 24th of May 2020 we are introducing some changes:

- I. The Holy Masses will be celebrated with opened doors with ushers helping to control the number of people in the church building not to exceed the %40 required by the State. Please note that Masses will continue to be streamed online. And if anyone wishes to have confession and receive Holy Communion please call Father to make arrangements.
- II. It is important to let the Church office know of who is coming to make arrangements because our church can only hold 38 people keeping the social distancing rules in case we will have more people wishing to come we will move the service down to the church hall where we can have twice that number.
- III. We have a company doing the disinfecting and cleaning after each service.
- IV. All people attending Holy Mass should wear a face mask to protect themselves and others. Also please consider having your own sanitizers if you need any.
- V. Refrain from moving between floors within the church building and use only the facilities on the giving floor the service is in.
- VI. There will be no gathering or coffee hour at the end of the Holy Mass.

The Church need your help ushering people, please let Father know if you can perform this duty.

We all hope that these will be just temporary measures, it's a temptation that we all need to go through and endure. We thank you all for your understanding and may the Lord bless you all and keep you safe!
